

Wow, It is already the 1st of July. I can't believe it came so fast. THANK YOU Scott for a great year and your words of encouragement. Now, it's time to get to work.

I believe most of you have seen my goals for the year. They pretty much follow the goals of everyone before me. Growth of membership, retention of existing members and reporting each club's service projects. My #1 goal is, I would like every club in the district to end the fiscal year at a net growth of 2. This takes care of two goals in itself—growth and retention. Use the Global Membership approach to achieve this. Statistics with other Lions clubs proves that the process works. Now let's prove it with our own District 5M9 clubs! My next goal is to ensure that every club reports their service projects. Every club needs to report each month all of the activities for the previous month. Most clubs are reporting each month in My Lion, but for those who have held back, it is such an important step. I want to ensure that the district receives credit for the hard work clubs are doing in the community and the numbers also influence the availability of grant money for our district, multiple and region. Normally, it is the club secretary who does this but a few clubs have designated a separate reporting person to carry out this function as it lightens the tasks of the secretary.

Summer is a great time to be outdoors working along side fellow Lions members in the community whether helping with service projects, fundraisers, or just attending meetings. I'd like to suggest that each club work cooperatively with their local Kiwanis, Rotary or Chamber to co-sponsor one community-building activity this summer and fall. This will be your opportunity to show others why you do what you do...all the while having fun while doing it! One of Scott's 5M9 district visions was to sponsor an event where all our clubs in District 5M9 could come together for a common cause. On September 9th, thanks to the efforts of 1st VDG Denise and the Nisswa Lions, the district secured a grant (\$25,000 from LCIF) to have a picnic and package food for distribution among the hungry in our communities. We will have a pancake breakfast provided by the Nisswa Fire Department and the meal packing will take place at the Nisswa Community Center. I'd like clubs/ individuals to consider signing up for the event on the volunteer portal (https://www.signupgenius.com/go/5M9DistrictWidePackTo EndHunger). Every club within 5M9 that attends and helps pack food will be able to bring food back to their communities. Donations are welcome, too! The more money we gather, the more meals we can pack. We are hoping to have all 64 clubs within 5M9 participate...pack...eat pancakes...and have fun!

My first Cabinet meeting is coming soon. It will be July 30 at the Community Center in Vergas, MN. Everyone is welcome, but all cabinet members, project chairs, presidents and secretaries especially should be there to hear about policy changes and district updates. Also remember that there is a wealth of information in My Lion Learning Center for new and existing officers of your club. The Club Officer Training course provides an overview of officer roles, responsibilities and highlights club structure. You simply login with your email address and password (if you haven't logged in before you'll need to set up a password) and then navigate to Learn.

The Nisswa Lions Club received an award from Lions International: Kindness Matters, which is given annually to only a handful of Lions and Leos clubs from around the world. A successful D-feet day. Over \$400 was raised for hearing research. Connie K. and Shelia S. Enjoyed checking people in before their walk!






The Parkers Prairie "Summer Lent "Fish and Fries Event was a Big Success !!

LIONS 5M9 YOUTH OUTREACH SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Youth Outreach Committee of Lions District 5M9 is offering up to \$12,000.00 in college scholarships. The scholarships will be for the 2023-2024 school year.

To be eligible to apply for a scholarship a student: 1. Must be in the last year of an accredited 2-year program, final two years of a degreed college program, or final year of obtaining a graduate degree that leads toward a career which involves directly working with youth. 2. Have a major in a program which leads to a career in working with youth. 3. Have graduated from a high school that is within District 5M9 or their home is in District 5M9. The student can only receive this scholarship one time.

The Youth Outreach co-chairpersons of District 5M9 shall do the final selecting and awarding of scholarships.

Required scholarship application enclosures:

- **1.** A transcript of your college grades for all the years you have attended college.
- **2.** Two letters of recommendation. One should be from your college; an instructor or an adviser and the second letter from a member of your community or a Lions Club member.
- 3. Recent photograph; to be used for the awards ceremony if you are selected.
- 4. Completed scholarship application including the essay.

Criteria used to select recipients:

- 1. College GPA
- 2. Involvement in college and outside activities
- 3. The two letters of recommendation
- 4. The essay portion of the application


