What's the importance of doing your MMR (Monthly Membership Reports) each month? The purpose of these reports is to make sure we have accurate reporting of our membership, as we continue to grow. We hate to see our members leave, but for us to recover from the losses, we need to have the opportunity to find new members.

With that said, it is the responsibility of the club secretary to complete these reports each month, so that Lions International is current with changes in all the clubs in 5M9.

There are others changes that need to be made such as complete birthdates, marital and family status for family members. If they are members transferring into your club, please use their current membership number and only give a new member number if they are a new lion to the Lions Organization.

When entering new members into Lions International, report them immediately so that we have them recorded in a timely manner. It is important that we recognize these new members into our clubs, so they don't feel they are being left by the wayside.

Starting on February 1 - June 15, 2024, a contest will be held for sponsors entering new members to District 5M9. For each member you sponsor, your name will be added to a drawing to receive a Melvin Jones Fellowship. The drawing will take place on June 30, 2024, and I encourage all Lions in 5M9 to find new members but introduce them to our communities and the great things we are doing in 5M9. Together we can do bigger and better things with more hands helping to improve what we all do as Lions in 5M9.

Another important role for Lion's is **recognition!** Do you have a fellow Lion that goes above and beyond in your club or perhaps someone in your community that has supported your club with an event? Consider recognizing them with a plaque or award from one of the 13 projects you support as Lions. Check with our 5M9 project chairs as to what projects you can award them. Applications for the projects are on the 5M9 website or contact the project chairs for further questions you may have regarding the awards.

The Mid-Winter conventions have come to an end and all the districts have done a great job of presenting information to the Lions in their Districts. Please remember to pass on information to the Lions in your club that you learned at this year 5M9 convention.

I am so proud of the Lions in 5M9 and together we will do great things together. We have 4 months left to the 2023-2024 and let's go out with an increase in membership.

Lions of 5M9,

By now, you all should know that Lions International aims to reach 1.5 million members worldwide by June 30, 2027! At the end of January 2024, I was able to travel with DG Linda to Tower for 5M10's mid-winter convention. While at that convention, we were very fortunate to hear Lion Daniel Marney Elkins speak. He shared thoughts on membership.



Lion Daniel shared a couple of things with us. He discussed the "elevator"

speech. He said that we always hear to have an "elevator" speech ready for when people ask you about what Lions is and what we do. Typically, when thinking about an "elevator" speech, many will think about telling prospective new members about our history, including the dates 1917, 1925 and Helen Keller. We should be telling prospective new members about what we are doing now in our communities. New members want to hear about the service you are doing, the important projects that Lions are involved in, and what you will be doing in your communities. Those pieces of information are important to younger and new members. When talking to potential new members, find out what their passions are. This way, they can feel a connection to your club, and you can use them to start a new service project. Potential new members can bring new ideas to your club and they may even be willing to chair the project. When you get new members in your club, get them involved right away. When you get new members involved, they will feel welcome.

The final words Lion Daniel shared is to listen to potential new members' stories, tell them about Lions, and ask them to join our family. Lions is the world's best kept secret, use that information to your advantage!

Lion PDG Jay Norby shared some staggering information in last month's (February, 2024) newsletter. He shared a document showing that the average age of a Lion in 5M9 is 64 years old. We have 502 members aged 66-75, and 519 are aged 76 and older. The average age of a non-Lion member adult in 5M9 is 45.5 years old. In 10 years, how many of those lions, who are 64 and older, will be with us? Hopefully, most of them, but that may not be true. Everyone in 5M9 needs to work to find new members. Ideally, they would be ages 18-65. We want to continue to provide the fantastic service we already do in our communities and grow that impact. Remember, more hands equals more service!

Bringing in new members and retaining those we currently have is so important. You all are working so hard within your clubs to make lasting impacts on your communities. You all are doing a fantastic job serving those in your community! Keep up the excellent work you are all doing.

I am going to leave this month's article with the following quote for you to all ponder. "It is not the strongest of species that survives, nor the most intelligent that survives. It is the one who is the most adaptable." – Charles Darwin.



Hello Lions,

I am not very comfortable talking about myself. My passion is to motivate, inspire, and challenge Lions to be the best that they can be. But I am asking for your vote, and I have an obligation to you to show that I am qualified and worthy of that vote.

Let's talk about impact.

In 2016 we started KidSight as a Multiple District program.. I was appointed by the Council of Governors as the program manager, tasked to get the program up and running. Within a year we had raised over \$250K, bought 32 systems, and trained hundreds of Lions. I continue to lead a team of dedicat-



ed Lions as the Chair of the Board of Directors. To date, you, and your fellow Lions in our Multiple District, have screened over 178,000 kids with over 21,000 referred for follow up by an eye care professional. This program has changed thousands of lives in and out of Lions, and that is impact.

In 2019 I was selected as the Multiple District Global Leadership Team Coordinator, responsible for all the leadership training and development for our multiple district.

We now offer 2 Leadership Institutes each year rather than 1 every other year. ELLI, Emerging Lions Leadership Institute, designed for Lions who have not been a club president to help build stronger clubs. And RLLI, Regional Lions Leadership Institute, designed to give our Lions enhanced leadership skills. RLLI is truly a "leadership incubator". Since 2011, the earliest year that I have records for, 502 Lions have attended of that number 100 or 20% have been or will be a District Governor. That's impact.

So, that is some of what I have accomplished in our multiple district.

Outside of our multiple I have:

Facilitated 6 RLLIs, 4 Advanced Lions Leadership Institute (ALLI), 4 Faculty Development Institute (FDI), plus one local FDI in California and Wisconsin.

I have earned the Lions Certified Instructor designation (LCIP), the highest instructor qualification awarded by Lions International and have facilitated 2 LCIP Institutes.

I have been entrusted by the last 3 International Presidents, Doug Alexander, Brian Sheehan and Dr. Patti Hill with the training of their incoming District Governors as a District Governor Elect Group Leader, one of 30 Lions from around the world, tasked with this important responsibility.

I am on the faculty of Lions University and have presented at 7 USA/Canada Leadership Forums.

But what do I offer you and the International Board as a member?

There are 10 major committees where a director can serve. I believe, based on my business and Lions experience, that I can add value to 6 of these committees.

Finance, Leadership Development, Marketing, Membership Operations and Services, Membership, and Service Activities,

But these are not the most important reasons I would like to serve on the board, I want to serve to represent you. To be your voice, to carry your questions and concerns to the highest levels of our association. To be able to help our districts solve local problems and provide guidance and motivation to our Lions and our leaders.

I would not have been able to accomplish any of this without a dedicated service partner, a Lion who can hold her own on any stage, the love of my life, my Lion Cheryl. Together we will work hard to make you proud as your representative on the International Board.

We need your support. Please plan on attending the Multiple District Convention in Winnipeg April 19-21 as a voting delegate. Together we can make our association the envy of all other service organizations in the world.



15th Annual Minnesota Lions Diabetes Foundation Research Update March 16, 2024

Hosted by the Minnesota Lions Diabetes Foundation, Inc.

More than 29 million people in the United States are living with diabetes — a growing number that includes 340,000 people in Minnesota alone. Unfortunately, that number is on the rise.


