


Director Snider became a Lion in 1981 when he joined the St.

1930-1931

Lionism in District 5, Minnesota, Manitoba, North Dakota, Saskatchewan, and South Dakota, passed through its most trying year in the period between June 30, 1930 and June 30, 1931. This section of the United States and Canada was perhaps harder hit by the drought than any other in the continents, and financial difficulties were in proportion. Yet Lionism carried on, and nowhere in all the world was a finer spirit of optimism and helpfulness shown.

When the convention met at Huron, South Dakota, on June 10-12, 1931, 46 clubs were represented, with a total registration of 274. International President Julien C. Hyer went all the way from Fort Worth, Texas, to attend the convention and deliver the principal address.

This District #5 remains a unit in International as before, but the vast territory covered and the number of clubs included made it necessary to have more than one District Governor. Accordingly, Arthur O. Lee of Northfield, Minnesota, who had been District Governor in 1930-31 of the entire District, was elected District Governor of Minnesota and Manitoba; W. Murray Allen of Grand Forks, North Dakota, was elected District Governor of North Dakota and Saskatchewan; and Homer A. Hill, of Huron, South Dakota, was elected District Governor over South Dakota. All three elections were unanimous, no opponent appearing against any of the three nominees. The delegates voted to hole the 1932 District Convention at St. Cloud, Minnesota.



So how do we make a project bigger and more ambitious? Let's work together. A few ideas would be to collaborate with a neighboring lions club and do the service project together. Or we could do a service project with all clubs within a zone. Better yet, we could partner with another service organization within our community as in Rotary, Jaycees, and the VFW. These are just a few examples of the opportunities of partnership.

Support local and global causes. Have you found that your clubs' donations are to the same local causes each year? When is the last time you have given a donation to something new? Take the time to research a new charity or nonprofit in your community that you could start to support. To have a positive impact on global causes, donating to LCIF should be a component of your planned giving within your club.

I challenge all of us the following actions that align to President Brian's Goals:

- Create and implement a new service project within your club this year.
- Discuss and execute a strategy of an existing service project within your club, to have a broader reach and impact than current state.
- Identify a local and LCIF global cause to donate to, that you have not given to in the past.





- 7. Large lettering on the poster is encouraged, because it will show up better.

 Keep the message simple. Posters should be similar to a highway billboard sign.
- 8. Have students put their name on the **back** of the poster, along with their school, grade, and sponsoring club. One student per poster; no partnering.
- 9. Judging: Each Lion and Lioness club is to submit their winning poster to the District Youth Outreach Chairperson on or before 10:30 a.m. on Saturday of the Mid-Winter Convention in January. Everyone attending the convention will have a chance to vote for his or her favorite.
- 10. District winners will be announced prior to the close of the convention.

LIONS INTERNATIONAL PEACE POSTER CONTEST RULES

A kit must be purchased for each contest sponsored. Each kit includes a sticker to be placed on the back of the winning poster prior to forwarding it to the next level of judging. Entries not featuring an official sticker on the back or meeting the rules listed below will be disqualified.

Only a Lions club can sponsor the contest in a local school(s) or organized, sponsored youth group(s), such as YMCA programs, Boys & Girls Clubs, Scouts, etc. *A Lioness club can sponsor the contest through its sponsoring Lions club.*Note: The contest cannot be held in youth groups that a Lions club sponsors, such as a Leo club or Scout unit. However, individual members of those groups (such as Leos or Scouts) may participate if the contest is held at their school or other organized youth group.

Contest is open to students who will be 11, 12 or 13 years of age on November 15. Eligible birthdates can be found under the Contest Rules & Conditions found in the Peace Poster kit.

Artwork must be no smaller than 13 inches by 20 inches (33 centimeters by 50 centimeters) and no larger than 20 inches by 24 inches (50 centimeters by 60 centimeters). Do not mat or frame artwork.

Only one entry per student per year, and each entry must be the work of only one student.

All artwork must be the individual student's original creation. Duplications are not accepted.

All media are accepted. Note: Chalk, charcoal and pastel entries should be sealed with a fixative spray to prevent smearing. Do not laminate entries.

Three-dimensional entries will not be accepted. Nothing may be glued, stapled or attached to the artwork in any way.

The use of lettering or numbering on the front of the poster, in any language, is not allowed. All artist signatures or initials should be written on the back of the poster.

Artwork should be done on a flexible material, so it can be rolled for shipping in a mailing tube. Do not fold poster.

Participants accept all responsibility for late, lost, misdirected or illegible entries. Entries sent with insufficient postage will be disqualified. Lions Clubs International is not responsible for entries damaged, destroyed or lost during the judging process. Entries cannot be acknowledged or returned; they become property of Lions Clubs International upon receipt. Peace Poster Contest images cannot be used without written permission from Lions Clubs International.

In consideration for the opportunity to enter the Peace Poster Contest, participants agree to allow Lions Clubs International to use their names and photographs for promotional and publicity purposes. In addition, the international grand prize winner, two family members (one being a parent or legal guardian) and the sponsoring club president or a club member (as designated by the sponsoring club president) are required to attend the award ceremony at Lions Day with the United Nations. An international grand-prize winner is not eligible to receive subsequent prizes in future Peace Poster contests sponsored by Lions Clubs International. By entering, participants agree to be bound by these rules and the decisions of the judges and Lions Clubs International.

Lions Clubs International may cancel the contest without notice at any time. The contest is void where prohibited, taxed or restricted by law.
