Where do we start with Mission 1.5?

You just need to find that one person, with a passion and the willingness to take that first step forward to say, "I want to be a Lion."





Can Do Canines to Host Open House November 11

Can Do Canines invites you to attend an open house on Saturday, November 11, from 12-2 p.m., at its Can Do Canines campus (9440 Science Center Drive, New Hope, Minnesota). Potential volunteers, clients, or anyone who might be interested in supporting the organization are invited to attend to learn how an assistance dog changes the life of a person with a disability.

Through a self-guided tour, attendees will be able to watch a trainer working with an assistance dog, hear from a volunteer dog host, talk with staff members from the volunteer



department, pose questions to client services coordinators about the application process, and meet graduate teams from each of the five types of areas Can Do Canines trains dogs: hearing, mobility, seizure, diabetes, and childhood autism. The assistance dog demonstrations will be held at 12:15, 1:55, and 1:35, and the dog host will speak at 12:15, 12:35, and 1:15.

There is no pre-registration for this event, though attendees will be asked to share some contact information when arriving.

Eyes for Mexico—My First Mission

I joined a new Lions Club in July of 2022. Our club is the East Gull Lake Camp Confidence Lions Club. Our club is a specialty club made up of individuals with various disabilities. When our guiding lion Less Swift was educating us on all the entities that Lions International assists with; the "Eyes for Mexico" peeked my interest. Not only I, but several of our Lions asked questions to learn more. I was able to get ahold of Dr. Radke via email and that set the plans in place for my first ever mission trip. Not only was this my first mission trip...it was my first time ever visiting Mexico. I was quite nervous as I had never met anyone I was going on this mission with and only had contact with Dr. Radke via email and text messaging. The day we left for Mazatlán, Mexico in March of 2023 I met Dr. Radke, Ken and Helen Foltz at the airport. They all were very kind and gave me a warm welcome. I was immediately at ease and felt comfortable. The mission was very impressive and well planned out considering it was the first mission open to the public post Covid. Dr. Radke and Mr. Foltz did the resting for appropriate prescription needed and wrote the prescription on a card. Our guests then went to a larger room where 4-6 of us would find the appropriate glasses needed for each individual. There were several boxes of glasses marked with either men/women, single/bifocal/stigmatized and the strength in numerical order.

When you see the smile on someone's face because they will be able to see the location on public transportation, or help their child read, it gives one a sense of accomplishment and pride.

The first day we helped like 40 people. On the second day word had gotten around and we helped so many more people. On the third day there were even more people and we worked almost 11 hours? I never realized how much of a need that basic glasses are to others not in the USA. I enjoyed this trip so much and I am inspired to continue this work. The need for glasses and volunteers is real. This year I am happy to announce that Lion Ashley W., myself, Lion Bobbi L and Lion Mary D will be joining the Mazatlán Eyes For Mexico trip this March, 2024. Thank you Dr. Radke and Mari for all your hospitality and education on this very important mission. I am truly grateful to be a small part of a huge and wonderful service project.

While donation affects many people, few people know how the organ, eye and tissue donation process works.





Who can register to donate?

Every individual has the right to sign up to donate their organs, eyes and tissues at the time of their ceath. While becoming a donor is rare, we need everyone to register to help increase the odds that people in need will receive a transplant.



Will age or health prevent me?

Your age or health does not prevent you from registering. Most health conditions do not prevent conation and age is not a factor. Medical advances now allow people with many chronic conditions to conate. Don't rule yourself out – register!



What does my religion say about donation?

All major religions in the U.S. support donation and consider it to be a generous and compassionate act of caring. Donation organizations coordinate with families and hospitals to make sure the donor's beliefs, practices and ceremonies are respected.



Is my life the priority?

Yes, If you are taken to the hospital after an accident or injury, it's the hospital's number one priority to save YOUR life. Your status as a donor is not even considered until every effort has been made to try to save your life.



How does the waiting list work?

The waiting list is actually a pool of people. Factors such as blood type, body size, location, severity of illness and length of time on the waiting list are used to determine the best candidate for an organ.



How do corneal transplants help people?

While the comes (the clear tissue in the front of the eye) is the only part of the eye regularly transplanted, the sciera (white of the eye) can also be used in some surgeries. Comesi transplants are one of the most frequently performed transplants. They restore sight and improve quality of life so that people can reclaim their lives, benefiting patients from newborn to 103 years old!

Suggested Subject: Drug/Alcohol abuse, Awareness, Violence, Volunteering, Citizenship, Peer Pressure, Healthy and Positive aspect of life growing up. **NO COPYRIGHT SUBJECTS! NO LICENSED IMAGES!** (Cartoon characters).

Large lettering on the poster is encouraged, because it will show up better.

Keep the message simple. Posters should be similar to a highway billboard sign.

Have students put their name on the **back** of the poster, along with their school, grade, and sponsoring club. One student per poster; no partnering.

Judging: Each Lion and Lioness club is to submit their winning poster to the District Youth Outreach Chairperson on or before 10:30 a.m. on Saturday of the Mid-Winter Convention in January. Everyone attending the convention will have a chance to vote for his or her favorite.

District winners will be announced prior to the close of the convention.

Prizes to be awarded by 5M9 Youth Outreach: 1st place - \$100, 2nd place - \$75, 3rd place - \$50. All other participants will receive a \$25 gift card.

LIONS 5M9 YOUTH OUTREACH SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Youth Outreach Committee of Lions District 5M9 is offering up to \$12,000.00 in college scholar-ships. The scholarships will be for the 2023-2024 school year.

To be eligible to apply for a scholarship a student: 1. Must be in the last year of an accredited 2-year program, final two years of a degreed college program, or final year of obtaining a graduate degree that leads toward a career which involves directly working with youth. 2. Have a major in a program which leads to a career in working with youth. 3. Have graduated from a high school that is within District 5M9 or their home is in District 5M9. The student can only receive this scholarship one time.

The Youth Outreach co-chairpersons of District 5M9 shall do the final selecting and awarding of scholar-ships.

Required scholarship application enclosures:

- 1. A transcript of your college grades for all the years you have attended college.
- **2.** Two letters of recommendation. One should be from your college; an instructor or an adviser and the second letter from a member of your community or a Lions Club member.
- **3.** Recent photograph; to be used for the awards ceremony if you are selected.
- **4.** Completed scholarship application including the essay.

Criteria used to select recipients:

- 1. College GPA
- 2. Involvement in college and outside activities
- 3. The two letters of recommendation
- 4. The essay portion of the application

All letters and submissions must be in print form. No hand-written documents will be accepted.
