This past Saturday, I was given the opportunity to tour the Lions Leader Dog facility near Detroit, Michigan. What an experience! I was so impressed by how well behaved all of the dogs were. During our discussions with their owners, the dogs simply and quietly laid under the tables at the feet of their handlers.

Leader Dog is a program still very much in its infancy having just scratched the surface providing "helper" dogs to the many people who qualify for them. At this time there are 1263 Guide Dog Teams throughout the US and Canada. The facility has approximately 40 puppies waiting until they reach the age of 6 weeks old to be assigned a Puppy Raiser who will teach them the basic commands and skills such as sit, stay, heel and potty training. The dog is then matched to a person receiving the dog and, at that point, dog and receiver train together. They get to know each other and learn each other's quirks. Finally, after about 3 weeks, they are sent out to recipient homes to continue being a life-line for the blind. When it becomes time for the dog to retire, the elder dog is returned to the facility to live out his life of service. The person in need receives a new dog and the process starts over.

The Leader Dogs organization needs donations from every club to continue training dogs for service and support of those in need. Please give generously to maintain and grow this service opportunity for the blind.

1929-1930

District #5 was very proud of its accomplishments during 1929-1930. It is the largest District geographically, covering 900,000 square miles, and that year's work makes it the third largest in member units. The number of clubs in full membership increased an even fifty percent, and the membership very nearly as much. The District still included Minnesota, the Dakotas, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and Alberta.

The eleventh annual District Convention was held at Regina, Saskatchewan, on June 11, 12, 13, 1930, and was attended by almost 400 deligates and visitors. The splendid spirit of amity and good fellowship that prevailed marked it as by far the most truly International convention the District had ever held, and a wonderful omen for the future.

Ben A. Ruffin, International Past President, of Virginia, was the principal speaker. He was in his happiest vein, and his eloquent speech was greatly appreciated. He was introduced by International Past President E. W. Cameron of Minnesota.





LIONS 5M9 YOUTH OUTREACH SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Youth Outreach Committee of Lions District 5M9 is offering up to \$12,000.00 in college scholarships. The scholarships will be for the 2022-2023 school year.

To be eligible to apply for a scholarship a student: 1. Must be in the last two years of a degreed college program. Graduate students are not eligible for this scholarship. 2. Have a major in a program which leads to a career in working with youth. 3. Have graduated from a high school that is within District 5M9 or their home is in District 5M9. The student can only receive this scholarship one time.

The Youth Outreach co-chairpersons of District 5M9 shall do the final selecting and awarding of scholarships. **Required scholarship application enclosures:**

- 1. A transcript of your college grades for all the years you have attended college.
- **2.** Two letters of recommendation. One should be from your college; an instructor or an adviser and the second letter from a member of your community or a Lions Club member.
- **3.** Recent photograph; to be used for the awards ceremony if you are selected.
- **4.** Completed scholarship application including the essay.

Criteria used to select recipients:

- 1. College GPA
- 2. Involvement in college and outside activities
- 3. The two letters of recommendation
- 4. The essay portion of the application

All letters and submissions must be in print form. No hand-written documents will be accepted.

District 5M9 Youth Outreach Poster Contest 2022-2023

Your Youth Outreach chairpersons are asking that each club sponsor this contest in their school by awarding some prizes at the local level and to bring your winning poster to the Mid-Winter Convention.

Contest Rules:

- 1. Eligibility: Contest open to 6th, 7th, & 8th grade students in all schools in District 5M9.
- 2. Dates: Contest runs from now to January 6, 2023.
- 3. The clubs will have to set up a date to pick up the posters at the schools so that you may do your voting and pick the local winners and the overall winning poster that you will bring to the convention
- 4. <u>Size: 18"x24"</u> poster quality material. We recommend Pacon Tagboard; Item #5220; available at office supply stores and online. (@\$30 per 100) All others sizes will be disqualified.
- 5. Medium: Any paint, crayon, marker, pencil, etc. **No embellishments**.
- 6. Suggested Subject: Drug/Alcohol abuse, Awareness, Violence, Volunteering, Citizenship, Peer Pressure, Healthy and Positive aspect of life growing up. **NO COPYRIGHT SUBJECTS! NO LICENSED IMAGES!** (Cartoon characters).
- 7. Large lettering on the poster is encouraged, because it will show up better.

 Keep the message simple. Posters should be similar to a highway billboard sign.
- 8. Have students put their name on the **back** of the poster, along with their school, grade, and sponsoring club. One student per poster; no partnering.
- 9. Judging: Each Lion and Lioness club is to submit their winning poster to the District Youth Outreach Chairperson on or before 10:30 a.m. on Saturday of the Mid-Winter Convention in January. Everyone attending the convention will have a chance to vote for his or her favorite.
- 10. District winners will be announced prior to the close of the convention.
- 11. Prizes to be awarded by 5M9 Youth Outreach: 1st place \$100, 2nd place \$75, 3rd place \$50. All other participants will receive a \$25 gift card.
- 12. Poster images become the property of District 5M9 and may be used for display, etc.
- 13. Posters and prizes will be released to the sponsoring clubs at the end of the convention.

LIONS INTERNATIONAL PEACE POSTER CONTEST RULES

A kit must be purchased for each contest sponsored. Each kit includes a sticker to be placed on the back of the winning poster prior to forwarding it to the next level of judging. Entries not featuring an official sticker on the back or meeting the rules listed below will be disqualified.

Only a Lions club can sponsor the contest in a local school(s) or organized, sponsored youth group(s), such as YMCA programs, Boys & Girls Clubs, Scouts, etc. *A Lioness club can sponsor the contest through its sponsoring Lions club.*Note: The contest cannot be held in youth groups that a Lions club sponsors, such as a Leo club or Scout unit. However, individual members of those groups (such as Leos or Scouts) may participate if the contest is held at their school or other organized youth group.

Contest is open to students who will be 11, 12 or 13 years of age on November 15. Eligible birthdates can be found under the Contest Rules & Conditions found in the Peace Poster kit.

Artwork must be no smaller than 13 inches by 20 inches (33 centimeters by 50 centimeters) and no larger than 20 inches by 24 inches (50 centimeters by 60 centimeters). Do not mat or frame artwork.

Only one entry per student per year, and each entry must be the work of only one student.

All artwork must be the individual student's original creation. Duplications are not accepted.

All media are accepted. Note: Chalk, charcoal and pastel entries should be sealed with a fixative spray to prevent smearing. Do not laminate entries.

Three-dimensional entries will not be accepted. Nothing may be glued, stapled or attached to the artwork in any way.

The use of lettering or numbering on the front of the poster, in any language, is not allowed. All artist signatures or initials should be written on the back of the poster.

Artwork should be done on a flexible material, so it can be rolled for shipping in a mailing tube. Do not fold poster.

Participants accept all responsibility for late, lost, misdirected or illegible entries. Entries sent with insufficient postage will be disqualified. Lions Clubs International is not responsible for entries damaged, destroyed or lost during the judging process. Entries cannot be acknowledged or returned; they become property of Lions Clubs International upon receipt. Peace Poster Contest images cannot be used without written permission from Lions Clubs International.

In consideration for the opportunity to enter the Peace Poster Contest, participants agree to allow Lions Clubs International to use their names and photographs for promotional and publicity purposes. In addition, the international grand prize winner, two family members (one being a parent or legal guardian) and the sponsoring club president or a club member (as designated by the sponsoring club president) are required to attend the award ceremony at Lions Day with the United Nations. An international grand-prize winner is not eligible to receive subsequent prizes in future Peace Poster contests sponsored by Lions Clubs International. By entering, participants agree to be bound by these rules and the decisions of the judges and Lions Clubs International.

Lions Clubs International may cancel the contest without notice at any time. The contest is void where prohibited, taxed or restricted by law.
